CAREER PROSECUTOR PROGRAM AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Career Prosecutor Program Audit Committee recommends the following amendments to the audit process:

REGULAR DOCKET

- 1. Clarify that the three years of continuous service, or five years of experience required to be eligible as a Career Prosecutor may include time served in a Commonwealth's Attorney's office as a grant funded or locality funded Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney.
- 2. Alter the audit timeline and the manner in which audit materials are provided to the Compensation Board in order to make the process less arduous for the offices that are selected to be audited. We recommend allowing 20 days from the date of notification by the Compensation Board for offices to provide the requested materials. Additionally, we recommend that offices be permitted to provide the materials electronically rather than by
- 3. Expand the auditees to include two categories of career prosecutors chosen for audit:

Category 1 to include 15 individuals who have been selected into the Career Prosecutor Program, chosen at random to undergo the currently established audit process.

Category 2 to include every individual selected into the Career Prosecutor Program in the current calendar year, to undergo a limited review to verify documentation of the 40 additional hours of specialized training in addition to the hours required by the State Bar. An audit under Category 2 would meet the definition of "previously audited" for further Category 1 audits.

4. Clarify the time period for which the career prosecutor provides "documentation of legal education completed in the most recent 12 months..." to instead be the most recent year's completed State Bar MCLE cycle (November to October).

The Compensation Board approved the changes requested by the audit committee, except that the Board approved changing the time period for providing return of requested materials from the selected office to the Compensation Board upon notification of audit from the current requirement of 7 business days to 10 business days (and not to 20 business days).
